



Sidelines restaurant owner to open Fire Side Pub in East Liberty

A new restaurant/pub with an open show kitchen is set to open this summer on Broad Street in East Liberty.

Robert Miller and Jessica Martin Adams will open The Fire Side Pub at 6290 Broad St. in the former Station Street Hot Dogs space.

The restaurant will feature 70 seats inside and 30 seats outside, with a show kitchen centered around a Grillworks oven. They're shooting to open in July.

Mr. Miller also owns Sidelines Beer House in Sewickley, which opened in 2012, and Sidelines Bar & Grille in Millvale, which opened in 2003.

What's different about this location, said Mr. Miller, is that it's not going to be a sports bar. He said diners will have the option of interacting with their server as well as the chef as he prepares and plates food from the wood-fired oven.

"Ninety percent of the menu will come from the grill," Mr. Miller said.

The menu will include sandwiches, burgers, small plates and entrees. The Fire Side Pub will also encourage craft beer and wine pairings.

Ms. Martin Adams, Mr. Miller's sister-in-law, has been working with Mr. Miller for more than 10 years. She will move from the Sewickley restaurant to run the East Liberty property. Mason Arthurs, who heads up the kitchen in Sewickley, will join her in the move to become the executive chef of the

restaurant.

“Mr. Miller is a seasoned restaurant operator and I think their concept will be welcomed with open arms in the blossoming East Liberty community,” said Terri Sokoloff of Specialty Bar & Restaurant Brokers, which handled the lease.

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
